The Windmill Primary Federation believes that uniforms are an important element in nurturing a sense of identity and responsibility. All Federation schools have a uniform which is accessible to all pupils and their families and which represents value for money. To this end, we have kept branded items to a minimum.

We expect all our children to wear a school jumper or cardigan carrying our logo. Uniform items featuring our logo, in line with our individual school colours, must be purchased from Price & Buckland. All other items can be purchased from any High Street store or supermarket.

Our Uniform consists of the following:

- Cardigan or sweatshirt (with school logo)
- White polo shirt
- White, black or grey socks, or plain grey tights
- Charcoal grey trousers, shorts or pleated skirt, or grey pinafore dress
- Gingham summer dress in school colours
- Black shoes (trainers are not permitted). If your child wears shoes with laces please ensure that they are able to tie them up.

PE Kit and Bag

- White T-shirt – no logos.
- Black shorts
- Black track suit (crew neck sweatshirt – no hoodies)
- Trainers or plimsolls

Additional Items

If you would like to include an old t-shirt or shirt for children to wear during art projects in order to protect their uniforms this is welcomed.

Expectations

We expect all pupils to comply with this uniform policy. Any pupil who falls short of these requirements will be advised of this fact by their class teacher and given the opportunity to improve. Continued failure to complete will be brought to the attention of the senior leadership team.

Jewellery & Make Up

Stud earrings and basic (not smart) watches are the only form of jewellery permitted to be worn at school. Stud earrings should be removed or covered with tape for PE. Make up and nail polish is not permitted to be worn.

Role of Parents

We believe that one of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, that it is clean, in good repair and that the child's name is written on all items.

Role of Governors

The Governing Body supports the Executive Headteacher in implementing the School Uniform Policy. It liaises with the Headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity. It is the governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the school's Uniform Policy allows children to dress sensibly in clothing that is durable, safe, and practical.

Where to buy School Uniforms

When looking for our uniform supplier, cost and value for money was the most important consideration. Branded school uniform can be purchased from Price and Buckland. Non-branded items of uniform can also be bought from most major stores and supermarkets at competitive prices.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Do items of uniform have to have a school logo on them?

A: *The only item that we require a school logo on is the jumper or cardigan.*

Q: Can I buy individual items of school uniform?

A: *Yes.*

Q: Do you require specific characteristics of shoes, coats and bags?

A: *We ask that shoes are black and that coats and bags are appropriate for a primary school.*

Q: Do you have items that are only required for extra-curricular activities or interschool competitions?

A: *No, the school will provide a separate PE kit for pupils when participating in sports festivals if needed.*

Q: Does the school have the facility to buy second hand uniform?

A: *Please enquire at the School Office.*

Q: Is there any financial support with purchasing the uniform?

A: *This can be discussed on an individual basis with the Headteacher.*
