- A strategically aligned enrichment offer

Our enrichment offer is strategically aligned with our vision and designed to broaden pupils' horizons, raise aspirations and develop confidence and resilience. We recognise that meaningful experiences beyond the classroom help pupils to develop the attitudes, skills and expectations needed for future education, employment and active participation in their community. Our offer promotes achievement, positive attendance, respect and tolerance, while ensuring that every pupil has equitable opportunities to participate. We proactively identify and remove barriers to engagement, recognising that sustained non-engagement may increase the risk of future disengagement from education, employment or training (NEET).

- A broad and well-rounded enrichment offer

We recognise that pupils' access to cultural capital can vary, so our enrichment offer is designed to broaden horizons, build confidence and ensure that every pupil experiences a rich and diverse range of opportunities beyond the taught curriculum. Alongside our knowledge-rich curriculum, pupils benefit from planned experiences that develop their social, cultural, personal, physical, spiritual, moral and future-facing skills, helping them to develop confidence, character and a strong sense of belonging.

Our enrichment programme is deliberately broad and well-rounded, with opportunities across six key areas: Broadening Horizons; Civic Engagement; Arts and Culture; Future Skills; Sporting Events; and Nature, Outdoors and Adventure. These experiences are carefully planned to complement our curriculum and reinforce our values, enabling pupils to develop resilience, independence, aspiration, empathy and respect while preparing them to participate positively and confidently in the wider world.

- A well-communicated enrichment offer that celebrates participation and achievement

Our enrichment offer is communicated consistently to pupils and families, with high aspirations for participation and achievement. We use a range of platforms, including letters, messages, newsletters, Class Dojo our website and face-to-face communication, to ensure that pupils and families are aware of the breadth of opportunities available and are encouraged to engage.

Participation and achievement are actively recognised and celebrated. We track pupils' experiences to ensure that opportunities are accessed equitably and that individual achievements are acknowledged. Pupils receive recognition through praise, rewards, certificates, challenges, celebration in school and wider media, as well as opportunities to take on additional responsibilities and leadership roles. In this way, participation becomes a valued part of school life and encourages pupils to develop confidence, pride and a willingness to embrace new experiences.



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- An enrichment offer that is shaped by the school community

Our enrichment offer is shaped by our values and the needs and aspirations of our community. It provides opportunities for pupils to work as part of a team, compete, perform, create, develop independence, lead, care for others and nurture their own interests and talents. Ambition, Tolerance, Respect, Kindness and Pride underpin these experiences and are intentionally developed through participation.

We value the opportunities available within our local community and seek to connect pupils with these wherever possible, while also providing aspirational experiences further afield that broaden horizons and raise expectations of what is possible. We identify and deliberately develop the character traits, attitudes and behaviours that will help pupils to succeed in their future of choice, embedding these throughout our enrichment programme.

Through this approach, enrichment strengthens our sense of community and builds positive attitudes across pupils, families and staff, contributing to the shared identity and values of The Windmill Primary Federation.

- An accessible and engaging enrichment offer

Our enrichment offer is inclusive, equitable and designed to ensure that every pupil can participate and benefit, particularly those at risk of missing out. We proactively identify and address barriers that may limit participation or affect future life chances, with careful consideration given to the needs of pupils with SEND and disadvantaged pupils.

We use participation tracking, targeted funding and reasonable adjustments to ensure that individual needs are understood and supported, including bespoke arrangements where required. We work closely with pupils, families and external agencies to understand barriers, gather feedback and continually improve the accessibility and relevance of our offer. Through this approach, we ensure that enrichment is not simply available to all, but is actively designed so that every pupil is enabled and encouraged to take part, experience success and benefit from opportunities beyond the classroom.

- An enrichment offer that works in partnership

We work collaboratively with pupils, families, community partners and external agencies to shape, strengthen and extend our enrichment offer. We seek partnerships with organisations and individuals who share our ambition for every pupil to succeed, participate and develop the skills and experiences needed for their future. This includes local sports organisations, businesses and former pupils, arts and cultural organisations, youth and community groups, voluntary organisations and local authorities. These partnerships enhance opportunities for pupils while supporting our wider work around the Gatsby Benchmarks, safeguarding, aspiration, culture, confidence and access to funding and expertise.



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- An outcome-focused enrichment offer

We map and track each pupil's enrichment experiences from Reception to Year 6, enabling us to evaluate participation, identify gaps and ensure that every pupil benefits from a broad and balanced range of experiences. Every opportunity has a clear purpose and is carefully selected to complement and enrich our knowledge-rich curriculum, develop character and contribute to identified pupil outcomes. Our enrichment map sets out the minimum entitlement for every pupil, with participation monitored to ensure that no child misses out.

- A continually improving enrichment offer

We use participation data, pupil voice, self-evaluation and feedback from families and partners to continually review and improve our enrichment offer. We evaluate the breadth, quality and accessibility of provision across all six enrichment categories, monitor participation rates and identify pupils who may be at risk of missing out. We also consider the range of free, subsidised and paid opportunities available to ensure equitable access. This ongoing evaluation enables us to refine provision and maximise its impact on pupils' confidence, character, aspirations, skills and wider outcomes.

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Careers Programme to Broaden Horizons and Develop Future Skills:

Our careers programme broadens children's horizons early on, challenges limiting stereotypes, and connects everyday classroom lessons to future possibilities, helping all pupils see the real-world value of their education, which links to the Gatsby Benchmarks. The careers element of our enrichment map links subjects to real jobs and ensures there is a smooth transition between key stages. It broadens horizons, taking into consideration our rural location, challenges stereotypes and motivates our pupils.

Where it takes place at the Windmill Primary Federation: > Pupils learn about careers through the unit People Who Help Us in EYFS (YR) with stories, videos and visits from police, RNLI, dentists, nurses and other professionals. > In KS2 (Y4) a unit called My Dream Job encourages discussion, personal qualities, aspiration, money and financial tracking. > Lessons from the unit Dreams and Goals in EYFS/KS1 and KS2. > Raising Aspirations Programme (UKS2). > Life Skills Workshops.
Learning from career and labour market information	Gatsby Recommendations: > Use age-appropriate resources, such as picture books and online platforms, to introduce pupils to different careers and labour market trends. > Invite parents, carers, family members, previous pupils or local professionals to share their career journeys and experiences, making career information relatable and engaging. Where it takes place at the Windmill Primary Federation:



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	> Using Little People Big Dreams series to champion diversity within a range of career paths and labour trends. Inviting artists, sportspeople, authors, engineers, musicians, architects to speak to the children. > Through our Enrichment Map local community members, sportsmen, work exchange students come to the classroom (in person or virtually) to talk about their study, jobs and how they contribute to the community. > Advice and support for parents about careers and further education is regularly shared.
Addressing the needs of each pupil	Gatsby Recommendations: > Offer career guidance and activities that cater to individual interests and strengths. > Conduct self-assessment exercises and surveys to help pupils identify their likes, dislikes and areas of talent, guiding them towards career exploration. Where it takes place at the Windmill Primary Federation: > In KS1(Y2) children undertake a unit called My Learning Strengths where pupils identify their strengths and interests by creating 'all about me' posters. In KS2 (Y3) in a unit called My Dreams and Ambitions. We discuss how these qualities can relate to future careers. >In YR and Y1 pupils visit a teacher or staff member to experience roles within the school. >Pupils apply for roles and responsibilities, completing an application form outlining their personal attributes and suitability for the post. > Raising Aspirations Programme (UKS2). > Life Skills embedded into our school enrichment annual programme.
Linking curriculum learning to careers	Gatsby Recommendations > Integrate career-related themes into the curriculum to demonstrate the connection between subjects and real-world applications > Organise class projects that allow pupils to apply knowledge and skills in practical scenarios, illustrating how learning contributes to future careers. > Invite professionals or community members to share how specific subjects or skills are relevant in their jobs, broadening pupils' understanding of careers. Where it takes place at the Windmill Primary Federation: > Stem activities are embedded within the Art and DT curriculum, with opportunities to build structures in Y1, rockets in Y4 and textiles in Y5. Medicine, science and human care is a theme in EYFS via All about me, and the focus on the senses in Y1, human body in Y2, Y5 and the plague in Y4. Geography studying local area and local businesses (Yr5). History (Yr6) looks at suffragettes and women during Space Race, Cold War. Science weather learning looks at Met Office. > In Y3 a community project allows children to apply knowledge in a practical scenario via designing a community garden – PSHCE (Jigsaw). > Life Skills embedded into school enrichment offer including measuring for baking.



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	> Our roles and responsibilities require pupils to write application letters and fill in forms, staff are available to coach pupils through this. > Oracy focus in all subjects to build children's confidence; public speaking events begin in KS2.
Encounters with employers and employees	Gatsby Recommendations > Organise career talks or panel discussions featuring professionals from various fields to inspire pupils and answer their questions. > Invite local employers or employees to school events, such as career fairs or assemblies, to expose pupils to diverse career options in their community. Where it takes place at the Windmill Primary Federation: > No Outsiders, Debates, Visitor assemblies, PTA fundraisers and Medical visits expose children to a range of careers and opportunities. > Learn about the school and career pathways in Y5 and Y6 through taster days and transition visits to High School and university. > Work with local professions eg. visits to care home to volunteer and make food, carol singing, working with local area housing development group. > Visits into school e.g. police into EYFS and Yr1, along with local wood carver. > KS2 Raising Aspirations (Positive Footprints). Introduce a range of careers. > Police provide assemblies on their role and also current topical issues (POLEd). > Build in opportunities, in clubs and competitions where children are part of a team and required to practise and show up for events to represent the school.
Experiences of workplaces	Gatsby Recommendations > Arrange virtual or in-person visits to workplaces to give pupils a first-hand glimpse of different work environments and the roles of employees. > Partner with local businesses or community organisations to provide work-based experiences, such as shadowing or small projects. Where it takes place at the Windmill Primary Federation: > > Raising aspirations programme in KS2, online careers talks.
Encounters with further and higher education	Gatsby Recommendations > Introduce pupils to higher education opportunities, such as college, university or vocational training, to broaden their awareness of post-secondary pathways. > Organise visits to colleges or universities to expose pupils to campus life and various academic programmes available after secondary school. Where it takes place at the Windmill Primary Federation: > Year 6 transition days. > School trips include Sainsbury Centre at UEA.



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Personal Guidance	Gatsby Recommendations > Offer one-on-one or small group career sessions where pupils can discuss their aspirations and receive personalised guidance. > Provide resources and tools to help pupils set short-term and long-term goals that allow them to understand the steps needed to achieve each one Where it takes place at the Windmill Primary Federation: > Small group and one-to-one pastoral support for all transition. > Pupils have extra high school transition days as required. > Resilience scale on Jigsaw PSCE online platform. > Raising aspirations programme in KS2, online careers talks and CV writing sessions.
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
